We ask that you recruit at least one judge, who is not intended to judge your presentation (due to potential or apparent conflict of interest). Your designated judges will receive an invitation email during the **first week in March**.

When at least one of your designated judges accepts the invitation, you will receive a confirmation email. Thus, make sure to reach out to your designated judges and ask them to confirm that they will volunteer for judging at the symposium.

NOTE: The judge you designate will NOT evaluate your presentation due to conflict of interest.
