The goal of the symposium is to showcase student research and creative scholarship across all disciplines to a broad audience. To this end, judges do not need to be experts in the discipline for which they serve as a judge. Judging slots range from one to two hours, and times are available all day.

We ask that you recruit at least one judge, who is not intended to judge your presentation (due to potential or apparent conflict of interest). Your designated judges will receive an invitation email once you click "Submit". When at least one of your designated judges accepts the invitation, you will receive a confirmation email that your abstract has been successfully submitted. Thus, make sure to reach out to your designated judges and ask them to confirm that they will volunteer for judging at the symposium.
